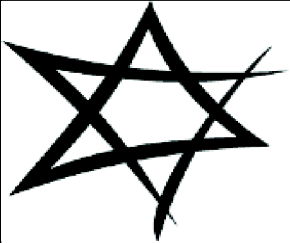

## High School:

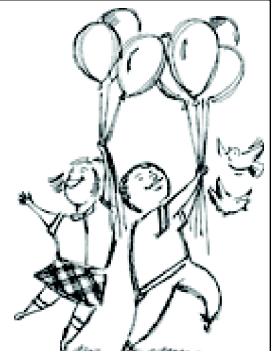

In college, I missed fellowship immensely. I didn't have the group of friends with which I felt the type of connection that comes with fellowship. I love my college friends. But the tie that brought me together with a group of people in "fellowship" was not something that I found during those 4 years. Growing up, I got a chance to experience fellowship at least 3 times a week. There were post-church conversations, Wednesday night adult hand bells and choir, Sunday afternoon youth group, choir and hand bells... my list could continue. These friends, old and young, would pray for me, support my faith journey and I would do the same. Fellowship was more- is more- to me than just having friends, or a casual conversation over coffee and donuts. Fellowship is deeper. Fellowship, for me, meant that someone was closely tied to me because of our shared faith and that in the same way I prayed for them and looked out for them, they did the same for me.

Being Christian requires fellowship. At the very least being Christian requires fellowship with Christ; at its best, fellowship happens between people of all ages within a community of faith. Here are some nerdy facts: Fellowship comes from the Greek word *koinonia* which derives from a word that means "common." At its very core, fellowship means we share something in common: we are brothers and sisters in Christ, and through His grace, we are saved. *Koinonia* is a more abstract term that implies a participation and partnership. There is a close bond among the people who practice *koinonia* (notice that one must "do" *koinonia*). They are joined together (as brother and sister) to participate in something together.

As a partner in anything, do we sit back, wait for things to happen and expect it to be a success without playing a part? Of course not. In *koinonia*, we are partners to each other: to support, to pray for, to listen, encourage and cry. "Laugh with your happy friends when they're happy; share tears when they're down" (Romans 12:15, MSG).

Ultimately, in fellowship, there is a goal: to deepen bonds, to develop family-ship and to support one another in their faith journey as we all work together to bring the kingdom of God to those around us. With that in mind, I am so excited to say flip back and check out all the incredible fellowship opportunities we have beginning in September. For children, young people, old people who feel young and those in between, we have something that will bless and enrich your life because of the fellowship. There are opportunities nearly every day of the week to join together in *koinonia* and it is incredible to see how inspired this congregation can become.

Each person in it is vital to the partnership we are in with Christ and with each other, and it is such a joy to be a part of it. "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another" (Prov 27:17). How have you participated in fellowship? Join us this fall for the beginning of a new year with fellowship, love, joy and family. We need you! Come and join us in *koinonia*. Join us in fellowship!

We hope that you will find it a fun and engaging process because we all get involved. Next, the saddlebag is hurried on to the next household assigned to the saddlebag. The next household repeats the process and so forth until the saddlebags have made their way throughout the church family. It will be a fun way to run the campaign and an opportunity to say hello to your neighbor when you drop off the saddlebag. There will be a lot more information forthcoming.

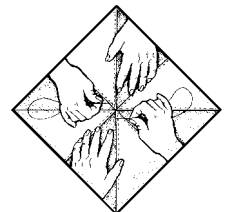

## A Heartwarming Interview With A Silent Hero, Chris Crisafulli

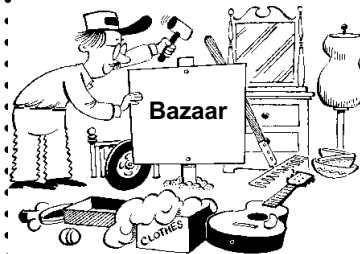
Chris Crisafulli has been in charge of the Discretionary Fund at Our Saviour for the last sixteen years. He took the position over from Pastor Palmer Clemmer in 1993. Pastor Clemmer would write out checks to needy families who came to the church asking for help. Chris considered the job as his ministry to others. Chris talked directly with each and every family in need. Most families who were seeking assistance were single parents and some were grandmothers who were raising their grandchildren. Chris distributed close to \$10,000 a year to families that came knocking at Our Saviour's door for help. One of his most memorable stories was about a lady who was the bread winner of her family. She had a tree fall on her and was in the hospital. Her husband had a broken neck and was in a wheel chair. Thanks to the generous contributions of OSLC members Chris was able to help this family through some difficult times.

Our Saviour Lutheran has been able to assist many individuals in times of need. Last year your Discretionary Fund addressed more than 300 problems and was able to assist over 180 individuals and families. It helped keep families in their homes, their electric power on, and provided assistance in a myriad of ways. OSLC is known in the Moore County community as a church that helps people. On October 14, 15, & 16 our Annual Bazaar will be raising money for the Discretionary Fund. I ask that you come out and support this fundraiser either by volunteering, contributing your unused stuff for sale, or purchasing items at the Bazaar. All proceeds from the sale will go to the Discretionary Fund. No monies go to administrative costs.

Let's keep Chris Crisafulli's ministry alive as a tribute to his wonderful work for so many years. Patti Herm is the new person in charge of the Discretionary fund. There will be an interview with Patti in the October issue of *The Pines* newsletter.
